Remarks from Alicia Córdoba, D.M.A. at her inauguration as the 9th President of Aquinas College

Thank you all so very much for being here today. It is an honor to stand before you as the ninth president of Aquinas College.

Little did I know that all of the beloved family trips to the Warren Dunes, or when taking my daughter to Blue Lake camp that one day, I would take the road to Grand Rapids to be with and lead the Aquinas College family, the destination of my now current life, work and vocation. God is truly great --- and mysterious.

With all humility, I believe God has been preparing me to serve you. At various points throughout my career, my mentors, friends and family would point to my abilities to organize, bring people together, to have a vision and make it a reality, and most importantly my desire to serve others in order to help them make their own hopes and dreams come true.

Despite and/or in addition to these skills, as you all by now know, I have a passion for music. I simply love to perform. It is the voice by which I have communicated the inner depths of my being for over fifty years. It is also the means by which I garnered my entrepreneurial spirit. My oboe often was my ticket to pay for school; to buy my next meal; to pay the rent; to travel the world; to teach; and to learn how to lead. God has graced me with the gift of music while showing me the pathway to my true vocation in Catholic higher education.

Graced by the gift to serve three Catholic institutions with different founding congregations and thus charisms for the Benedictines, the Marianists and now the Dominicans, I have learned the glory and fullness of living a Christian life, is a life of the mind, of prayer, and of study best lived and shared in community. In fact, it was St. Hildegard von Bingen, a 12th century Benedictine abbess who epitomizes for me the beauty of Catholicism as it is reflected through the wholeness of one's being. She was a writer, composer, philosopher, mystic, visionary, medical writer

and practitioner. She was mentor, confidant, and advisor to religious and secular leaders while establishing numerous abbeys and monasteries through Germany. She was a model of what the liberal arts mixed with professional skills and a great deal of fortitude and faith can accomplish. And she did all of it as a woman during the High Middle Ages. She taught me not to fear dreaming, to believe in the vision, and to keep my eyes and ears open to the calling of the Lord.

I have followed her lead and that of the other great leaders (including and especially my parents). Through their guidance, belief in me, and my own faith in God's support, I am here with you today, as your faithful and humble servant. As an Aquinas student said, "This is God's place." On the day of the announcement of my presidency, Sr. Aquinas waited until almost everyone had left the room to ask me a simple question. "Do you feel it?" Oh yes, I do "The Spirit is here with Aquinas and with you today. She was referring to the Holy Spirit whose presence was so strong that day. That feeling has not diminished and I pray it never does.

Students, if I can give you any advice, it is to believe in yourself. I believe in you. And periodically as you walk across campus on your way to class or to practice, look into the trees, listen to the wind, notice the colors and remember to thank God. I thank God for you.

With all of you present here, I would like to commit myself to you, as your president, to serve you with compassion and humility, to listen to you and bring joy, to value you and your work, and to work for and with you to make Aquinas College the premier Catholic college in the Midwest and beyond.

Lastly, I would like to publicly devote myself and my presidency to the Blessed Mother of Our Lord Jesus Christ. In so doing, I would like to read a poem I wrote about her while at the Basilica of Our Lady of the Pillar, La Nuestra Señora del Pilar. I will read it twice, once in Spanish, its original language and then in English. While I do so, I ask that you pray for Aquinas College, and for our students, faculty, staff, administration, and Board of Trustees. And please pray for me and my leadership, so that I may remain faithful to the needs of the institution and fullness of its mission.
