

**LEADING ENVIRONMENTAL  
 ACTIVIST AND PROPONENT OF  
 SOLAR POWER COMING TO  
 AQUINAS COLLEGE**

The Wege Foundation and Aquinas College present *Denis Hayes*, leading environmental activist and proponent of solar power, as the speaker at the Eleventh Annual Wege Foundation Speaker Series lecture on **Tuesday, March 27 at 4:00 p.m. in Aquinas College's Performing Arts Center.** Hayes will speak on *America's Energy Future*. A reception will follow. The event is free and everyone is welcome.

Denis Hayes has been selected by TIME magazine as a "Hero of the Planet." Currently President and CEO of The Bullitt Foundation in Seattle, Washington, Hayes is probably still best known for having been National Coordinator of the first Earth Day when he was 24. Hayes is internationally recognized for expanding the Earth Day Network to more than 180 nations. Earth Day is now the world's most widely observed secular holiday.

Hayes is a seasoned veteran of many environmental legislative and litigation victories over the years. During the Carter Administration, Denis directed the federal National Renewable Energy Laboratory. He has been a visiting scholar at the Woodrow Wilson Center, a senior fellow at the Worldwatch Institute, an adjunct professor of engineering at Stanford University, and a Silicon Valley lawyer.

Denis has received the national Jefferson Medal for Outstanding Public Service as well as the highest awards bestowed by the Sierra Club, The Humane Society of the United States, the National Wildlife Federation, the Natural Resources Council of America, the Global

Environmental Facility of the World Bank, the Interfaith Center for Corporate Responsibility, and the American Solar Energy Society.

He has served on dozens of governing boards, including those of Stanford University, the World Resources Institute, the Federation of American Scientists, The Energy Foundation, Children Now, the National Programming Council for Public Television, the American Solar Energy Society, Greenpeace, CERES, and the Environmental Grantmakers Association. He continues to chair the board of the international Earth Day Network.

## VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR THE CARPATHIAN ENGLISH SUMMER SCHOOL IN THE UKRAINE

The Ukrainian Catholic University in Lviv, Ukraine is seeking volunteers for its Carpathian English Summer School 2007. The month-long program, which runs **from July 4 to July 25**, offers a chance to live with Ukrainian college students, experience Eastern Christianity, and learn about the new challenges facing this ancient country. No knowledge of Ukrainian is necessary.

Contemporary Ukraine is increasingly opening up to the English-speaking world. There is an ever-growing demand for a high level of English language competency from the students if they are going to communicate effectively. One possible but expensive solution is to send students to English-speaking countries. A more economical solution, already tried and tested by UCU, is to create an English-speaking environment in Ukraine. The English Summer School provides a tremendous opportunity for our students to meet people from foreign countries and to gain a rich cultural experience.

Room and board are provided by the university in the beautiful Carpathian Mountains which traverse Ukraine, Romania, Poland, and Slovakia. Volunteers will only need to provide airfare to and from Lviv and spending money, which will not exceed \$250.00. They ought to have completed two years of college.

## MARILYN NELSON, AWARD-WINNING AUTHOR/POET, WILL DO A READING AT THE AQUINAS COLLEGE CONTEMPORARY WRITER SERIES

Acclaimed author/poet Marilyn Nelson will give a presentation at Aquinas College on **Thursday, April 12 at 7:30 p.m.** in the Wege Center Ballroom. The event is free and open to the public. Nelson gave the inaugural reading when the Contemporary Writer Series opened on September 15, 1997. It is fitting that she does the final reading of the 10-year anniversary series.

Nelson was brought up on various military bases and developed a unique perspective on the Armed Services as the daughter of one of the last Tuskegee Airmen. She started writing while in elementary school. Having earned her B.A., she went on to receive her M.A. from the University of Pennsylvania and her Ph.D. from the University of Minnesota.

Her books include *The Fields of Praise: New and Selected Poems* (1997), which was a finalist for the 1998 Lenore Marshall Poetry Prize, the 1997 National Book Award, and the PEN Winship Award; *Magnificat* (1994); *The Homeplace* (1990), which won the 1992 Annisfield-Wolf Award and was a finalist for the 1991 National Book Award; *Mama's Promises* (1985); and *For the Body* (1978); all published

by Louisiana State University Press. She has also published two collections of verse for children: *The Cat Walked through the Casserole and Other Poems for Children* (with Pamela Espeland, 1984) and *Halfdan Rasmussen's Hundreds of Hens and Other Poems for Children* (1982), which she translated from Danish with Pamela Espeland.

Nelson has received many honors for her writing including two Pushcart Prizes, two creative writing fellowships from the National Endowment for the Arts, a Guggenheim Fellowship, a Fulbright Teaching Fellowship, and the 1990 Connecticut Arts Award. She is a professor emerita at the University of Connecticut, Storrs, and has taught most recently at the University of Delaware.

The Aquinas College Contemporary Writers Series was founded by a grant from Aquinas alumni Tony Foster, M.D. and Linda Nemecek Foster, sponsors of Nelson's April 12 appearance. The series has brought many well-known authors to Aquinas College for public readings and workshops with students.
