CRITICAL THEORY ROUNDTABLE IN PRAGUE

Michaeleen Kelly recently received word that her paper "*A New Paradigm for Understanding the Right to Asylum: Responses to Arendt and Derrida*" has been accepted for presentation at the colloquium on "Philosophy and the Social Sciences" to be held from **May 10-13** at the Institute of Philosophy at the Czech Academy of the Sciences in Prague.

The colloquium was once a prominent part of the regular activities of the Dubrovnik Inter-University Center for Post-Graduate Studies, before the outbreak of the civil war in ex-Yugoslavia. For the past 30 years the colloquium, whose original directors were Jurgen

Habermas and Gajo Petrovic, has been held in the former Yugoslavia, then at the island of Ischia in Italy and now in Prague.

Kelly is very excited about the conference, despite the anti-American protest in Prague a few weeks ago in response to President Bush's announcement of a possible site in Prague for an anti-missile defense system.

Kelly would like to express her thanks to Jeanine Weber for her superb job of work she has done in providing her with research sources for this and other papers.
