The Department of Mathematics is delighted to announce that they have received word from the Michigan Department of Education that their proposed project to provide professional development for 6th grade teachers in algebraic reasoning (MathARTS-Algebraic Reasoning for Teachers and Students) has been funded. The grant award is for the full amount requested (\$143,906) for the time period July 29, 2005 through June 30, 2007, funded through Title II, Part A "Improving Teacher Quality."
