### **DOMINICAN BIBLICAL SCHOLAR, SISTER BARBARA E. REID, O.P., TO LECTURE AT AQUINAS**

The Second Annual St. Thomas Aquinas Lecture on the Catholic Intellectual Tradition is titled **"The Passion of Women and the Passion of Christ."** The lecture will be presented by **Aquinas Alumna Sister Barbara E. Reid, O.P., '75 '81, currently Visiting Dominican Scholar at the Aquinas Center of Emory University, Atlanta, and Professor of New Testament Studies, Catholic Theological Union, Chicago, on Monday, October 10 at 7:00 p.m.** in the **Aquinas College Performing Arts Center**. The lecture is free and open to the public.

Mel Gibson's film, "The Passion of the Christ," has stirred much interest in discussing the meaning of Jesus' passion and resurrection. The four gospel narratives of the passion and resurrection offer four differing theologies of the death of Jesus. Some interpretations of the passion can tend to fuel cycles of violence and victimization of abused persons. Women, in particular, are often encouraged to accept all kinds of suffering and abuse as their way of "carrying the cross" in the footsteps of Jesus. This lecture focuses on how the passion and resurrection narratives in the Gospel of John, with the image of Jesus who goes to calamity's depths for his friends, offers one image that has liberative possibilities.

After receiving her bachelor and master degrees from Aquinas, Sister Reid earned her doctorate

from Catholic University of America, Washington, D.C. Four of Reid's books have been published by Liturgical Press: "Choosing the Better Part? Women in the Gospel of Luke" (1996); "Parables for Preachers" (3 vols. 1999,

2000, 2001); and one with St. Anthony Messenger Press: "A Retreat with Luke" (2000).
