Tuition: \$528 per credit hour

Please note the following important information:

- Additional activities beyond class meeting times will be required for all courses.
- Nine graduate credits are considered full time. Permission is required for more than twelve credits per semester.
- Parking permits are required and available at Campus Safety (616 632-3754) at a cost of \$20 per academic year.
- Please notify the Graduate Education Office if you have an address or telephone number change. We attempt to contact students if a class is cancelled; keeping us updated could save you a trip to campus later!
- All coursework for the MAT degree must be completed within five years of the time enrolled in the first Master's course.

STATE COMPETENCY TESTS:

Any MAT student adding an endorsement to a Michigan teaching certificate must pass the Michigan Test for Teacher Certification (MTTC) for that endorsement area only. Contact the School of Education office for additional information and registration materials.

APPLICATION FOR DEGREE:

A student completing a master's degree must complete an application for degree one semester prior to the anticipated graduation date (December, May, or August). Contact the School of Education Office to obtain an application for degree.

FIELD COMPONENTS:

Some MAT courses require a field component. You are encouraged to contact your advisor or the instructor prior to registration for specific field component information.

DONNELLY SCHOLARSHIPS/HRUBY SCHOLARSHIPS:

New or prospective students may be eligible for tuition assistance. For information or to apply for the first time, please call Adult Student Recruitment at 616 632-2923. If you have already received a Hruby or Donnelly Scholarship, please call Financial Aid at 616 632-2893 each time you register for classes so the scholarship will be posted to your account.

ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE INFORMATION:

Payment is due in full by the first day of each semester unless you have applied and paid for our Multiple Payment or Employer Reimbursement plans. Unpaid accounts will receive AR HOLDS barring further registration until charges are paid in full, and will result in the application of interest charges of 1% per month. The Spring, 2010 semester begins January 11, 2010 and ends May 7, 2010. You may register via PHONEMAIL 24 hours a day. You may review your course schedule on My AQ; no printed verification will be mailed. Billing will follow from Student Accounts. Graduate students registering for graduate and undergraduate courses must call the School of Education Office at 616 632-2440 or 1 888 329-2748.

“My AQ” is an on-line resource available for current students to view their schedules, grades, financial information and to search for available classes in a given semester. Students are able to access the system at <http://myaq.aquinas.edu> using their ELM password (Electronic Login Manager).

Current students may register upon receipt of the schedule.

You are encouraged to register as soon as possible after receipt of the schedule to ensure the availability of your course selections. Under-enrolled courses will be cancelled.

Drop Policy

Students are responsible for initiating registration changes. Tuition refunds resulting from drops will be based on the date of official notification to the Graduate Education Office, not on the date that a class was last attended. **Students have until 4:00 p.m. on the 10th business day of the semester/quadmaster to drop a class for a full refund.** The 10th business day will *always* be the 2nd Friday of the semester/quadmaster. Any course dropped after 4:00 p.m. on the 10th business day will be charged at the full tuition rate. Full charges will be incurred for any classes dropped on or after the 11th business day. Third/Fourth Quadmaster, Directed Study, and Online classes must be dropped by 4:00 p.m. on dates indicated below.

To all students pursuing the elementary endorsement:

The Michigan Department of Education has mandated significant changes to the requirements for becoming an elementary teacher. Those students currently enrolled in the elementary endorsement program have until the end of the **Spring, 2013** semester to complete all required coursework and the elementary education practicum.

Current students are advised of the following:

- Students currently enrolled in the elementary endorsement program have until the end of the Spring, 2013 semester to complete all requirements.
- The deadline to complete all coursework and the elementary education practicum is by the end of the Spring, 2013 semester.
- The current Elementary Education test will be given for the last time in July, 2013. The test must be taken and passed no later than the July, 2013 administration.

Current students must meet the above deadlines in order to be certified under the current program requirements. It is unknown at this time if there will be the option after these deadlines for adding an elementary endorsement to a secondary teaching certificate. Any individual wishing to obtain an elementary endorsement should plan to do so before the requirements change.

We encourage you to have your records evaluated by the MAT program advisor to determine whether or not you will be able to complete the endorsement requirements within the State deadline. It is the responsibility of each student to request this review by contacting the School of Education. Your advisor will evaluate your records and contact you with more information.
