***Note: Times New Roman is the only accepted font style in APA formatting.**

Entire Books:

Print version:

Author', A.A. (1999). *Title of Work*. Location. Publisher.

Electronic version:

Author, A. A. (1997). *Title of work*. Retrieved from <http://www.abc.com/123>

Electronic version with DOI:

Author', A.A. (1999). *Title of Work*. doi:xxxxx

Edited version:

Editor, A.A. (Ed.). (2005). *Title of Work*. Location: Publisher.

Book chapters, reference book entries, essays in anthologies

Print version:

Author, A.A., Author B.B. (1995). Title of chapter or entry. In A. Editor & B. Editor (Eds.), *Title of book* (pp. xx-xx). Location: Publisher.

Electronic version:

Author, A.A., Author B.B. (1995). Title of chapter or entry. In A. Editor & B. Editor (Eds.), *Title of book* (pp. xx-xx). Retrieved from <http://www.eid.edu/e9q>

Electronic version with DOI:

Author, A.A., Author B.B. (1995). Title of chapter or entry. In A. Editor & B. Editor (Eds.), *Title of book* (pp. xx-xx). doi: xxxxxxxx

Journal article with DOI (digital object identifier)

Format:

Author, A. A., & Author, B. B., (Date). Title of article. *Title of Publication*, volume, pages. doi:xx.xxxxxxxxxx

Example:

Borman, W. C., Hanson, M. A., & Oppler, S.H. (1993). Role of early supervisory experience in supervisor performance. *Journal of Applied Psychology*, 78, 443-449. doi: 76.2103820384

Journal article without DOI

Format:

Author, A. A., & Author, B. B., (Date). Title of article. *Title of Publication*, volume, pages. Retrieved from <http://www.journalhomepage.org> (if applicable)

Electronic:

Fredrickson, B. L. (2000). Cultivating positive emotions to optimize health and well-being. *Prevention & Treatment*, 3(4). 38-45. Retrieved from <http://journals.apa.org/>

Print:

Light, M.A., & Light, I. H. (2008). The geographic expansion of Mexican immigration in the United States. *Law Enforcement Journal*, 8(1), 74-88.

****For information obtained from periodical databases, provide the home page URL of the journal, or of the book or report publisher.**

Newspaper and magazine articles:

Format:

Author's name. (Yr, Month Day). Article title. *Name of Publication*. Issue(vol)., page #.

Newspaper:

Schwartz, J. (1993, September 30). Obesity affects economic status. *The Washington Post*, pp. A1, A4.

Magazine:

Chamberlin, J. & Price, M. (2008 May). Psychologists fight back. *Monitor on Psychology*, 39(6). 26-30.

Electronic version:

Brody, J.E. (2007, December 11). Mental reserves keep brain agile. *New York Times*. Retrieved from <http://www.nytimes.com>

Multi-page document created by private organization

Format:

Author, A. A., & Author, B. B. (Date of publication). *Title of document*. Retrieved from <http://Web address>

Example:

Greater New Milford Area Healthy Community 2000, Task Force on Teen and Adolescent Issues. (n.d.). *Who has time for a family meal? You do!* Retrieved from <http://www.familymealtime.org>

*If no date, enter n.d. inside parenthesis

U.S. government report:

Format:

Agency name. (Date). *Title of report*. Publishing date: Publisher

Example:

National Institute of Mental Health. (1990). *Clinical training in mental illness* (DHHS Publication No. ADM 90-1679). Washington, DC: U.S. Government Printing Office.

*If no date, enter n.d. inside parenthesis

Chapter or section in an Internet document:

Format:

Author, A. A., & Author, B. B. (Date of publication). Title of article. In *Title of book or larger document* (chapter or section number). Retrieved from <http://www.someaddress.com/full/url>

Example:

Engelshcall, R. S. (1997). Module mod_rewrite: URL Rewriting Engine. In *Apache HTTP Server Version 1.3 Documentation* (Apache modules.) Retrieved from <http://httpd.apache.org/docs/1.3/mod/>
