## TO REGISTER FOR CLASSES:

### Traditional Age Students

- **If you have received notification of a faculty advisor assignment you should do the following:**

Meet with your assigned **FACULTY ADVISOR** between November 5 and 25 to select courses for 2010 Spring and to discuss your progress toward degree completion. Preparation for an appointment with an advisor should include a careful examination of the course offerings in advance, the preparation of a tentative schedule, and a list of questions that need further clarification.

Take the **SIGNED** registration card from your meeting to the Registrar/Academic Advising Center, located in Hruby Hall room 30, as soon as possible. **Your registration will be processed in the order it was received, according to your current class standing.**

**PROCESSING** of registration cards will take place on the dates listed below.

Registration cards will be processed by **DATE RECEIVED and by CLASS STANDING.**

➤ Seniors (94+ semester hours)	November 5 - 6
➤ Juniors (60-93 semester hours)	November 9 - 11
➤ Sophomores (28-59 semester hours)	November 12, 13; 16, 17
➤ Freshmen (0-27 semester hours)	November 18 - 20; 23 – 25

If you have not received notification of a faculty advisor assignment, please check your profile in MyAQ or contact the Registrar/Academic Advising Center at (616) 632-2866. You must have the signature of your Academic Advisor in order to register for classes.

If you are new to the college and have not yet been admitted, or you are returning to Aquinas after having been out at least one semester, contact the Admissions Office at (616) 632-2850.

### Continuing Education Students

- Registration can be accomplished in person, by phone at (616) 632-2866, or by mail through the Registrar and Academic Advising Center located in Hruby Hall room 30. You may submit your registration as soon as you receive your schedule and it will be processed according to your current class standing. The dates for processing are listed above. It is recommended that you go over your choice of classes with an academic advisor.
- If you are new to the college and have not yet been admitted, or you are returning to the college after having been out for at least one semester, you need to contact the Registrar and Academic Advising Center at (616) 632-2866 for admission procedures.

#### **Placement Testing:**

New Continuing Education Students may need placement testing in Reading, Writing and Mathematics. If placement testing is required for you, please contact the Mathematics department at (616) 632-2146 to schedule the math test. Contact the Registrar and Academic Advising Center at (616) 632-2866 to schedule the Reading and Writing component. Please also contact the Registrar's office if you have any questions about the placement testing.

## EXPLANATION OF FORMAT AND CALENDAR:

### Course Section Numbers:

The section code designates when a course is offered and for how many weeks. The section code will be the first digit in the section number. For example, section number 'S1' means the course is the first offering of a semester-long course.

### ***New Policy (as of Jan. 2008)***

- ***ADDING a course within the add/drop period (by Friday of the first week of classes) no longer requires an instructor's signature unless the class is full.***
- ***DROPPING a course no longer requires an instructor's signature.***

### **POLICIES REGARDING DROPPED COURSES, NO SHOWS, AND WITHDRAWALS:**

#### **DROPPED COURSES**

All students (Regular, CE, Graduate, Guest, Non-Degree, etc) have until 4:00 p.m. on the 10<sup>th</sup> business day of the semester/quadsemester to drop a class for a full refund. The 10<sup>th</sup> business day will *always* be the 2<sup>nd</sup> Friday of the semester/quadsemester. Any course dropped after 4:00 p.m. on the 10<sup>th</sup> business day will be charged at the full tuition rate. Traditional-age students are considered full-time as of the 11<sup>th</sup> business day of the semester if registered for 12 or more credits. Full charges will be incurred for any classes dropped on or after the 11<sup>th</sup> business day.

#### **NO-SHOW POLICY**

**Students who do not officially drop a class within the initial 10<sup>th</sup> business day add/drop period, and are administratively dropped from a class because of non-attendance, will be assessed a fee of \$150.00 per class. The last day to drop a class with no financial penalty is January 22 for 3<sup>rd</sup> Quad/Semester Classes and March 26 for 4<sup>th</sup> Quad classes.** For students officially dropping a class, either before the class starts or within the first two weeks of the class, there will be no charge. **It is not the instructor's responsibility to drop you from a class or to deliver your drop/add slip to the Registrar.**

#### **WITHDRAWALS**

The College assumes that a student beginning a semester intends to complete it. A student may choose to withdraw from all of their courses in a particular semester because of personal or health reasons. The student must notify the Registrar in writing of his/her intent to withdraw. Traditional full-time students will do this by completing a Withdrawal Form, available in the Registrar / Academic Advising Center. The student will incur tuition charges according to the date of written notification of their withdrawal. Academic penalties will be incurred for any courses that are past midterm at the time of withdrawal.

Title IV funds will be pro-rated for a complete withdrawal. Please reference the Financial Aid section of the College Catalog to understand this pro-ration. If a student withdraws from ALL classes AND receives financial assistance, the student must contact the Financial Aid Office for an exit interview. The student's rights and responsibilities concerning the College's refund policy will be discussed.

*Tuition and fees are due in full before the start of classes unless an approved payment plan has been processed through the Student Accounts Office. Your cancelled check is your receipt. If you need a formal receipt, please request one when you make your payment.*

### Payment Plans:

To assist students and parents with financing the cost of an Aquinas College education, the college offers two payment plans.

- **NELNET Business Solutions (formerly FACTS Tuition Management Plan)**

The Nelnet Business Solutions allows students to make convenient monthly payments by either automatic bank payments or by charging a MasterCard or Discover. Monthly payments can be spread over a period of up to 10 months, interest free. NBS charges an enrollment fee of \$30.00 per semester or \$50.00 per academic year to participate in this program. You may enroll online by visiting [www.aquinas.edu/e-cashier](http://www.aquinas.edu/e-cashier).

- **Employer Tuition Reimbursement Plan**

The Aquinas College Employer Tuition Reimbursement Plan allows students who expect to receive tuition reimbursement from their employer to apply for deferred payment of tuition. A non-refundable processing charge of \$50.00 per academic year is due with the application for this plan. The application must be approved by the Student Accounts Office. Once approved, the student may defer payment of tuition up to six weeks following the last class of the course.

Additional information and applications for the payment plans described are available from the Student Accounts Office, Hruby Hall 131, by calling 616-632-2864, or by visiting the Student Accounts web page at [www.aquinas.edu/studentaccounts](http://www.aquinas.edu/studentaccounts). In addition to the charges associated with the payment plans described, a service fee of one percent per month will be assessed on all past-due balances. A student whose account is delinquent will be dropped from the respective plan and the remaining balance for the semester or quadmester will be due and payable immediately. Students who are indebted to the college may be refused admission to examinations and will not be permitted to re-register or to receive a transcript of records or a diploma until all financial obligations are settled.

### Financial Aid:

To be considered for any source of financial aid, a student must complete all necessary applications by the appropriate deadlines. Financial aid is credited to a student's direct charges (tuition and, if applicable, room and board), based on the student's enrollment status for that given academic semester. (Full time = 12+ credits; Part-time = 6-11 credits). Financial aid is renewable each academic year, as long as the student completes the necessary application, maintains eligibility, and is making satisfactory academic progress toward a degree. Satisfactory progress for purposes of financial aid is defined by the same terms as the academic policy described in the college catalog.

If a student is on probation for two consecutive, full-time semesters or the equivalent, the student is no longer eligible to receive financial aid. A student has the right to appeal to the Aquinas College Review Board for Academic Dismissal. In order to restore eligibility for financial aid, a student must make satisfactory progress for a full-time semester or its equivalent without financial assistance. If a student drops a class during the refund period, financial aid will be adjusted. If a student withdraws from all classes and receives financial assistance, the Financial Aid Office must be contacted to discuss the student's rights and responsibilities concerning the college's refund policy.

**Contact the Financial Aid Office if you add or drop any classes as it may affect your awarded aid and/or loans.**

## COMPUTER ACCESS and INFORMATION

### Student Email Account Policy

**Every Aquinas College student is assigned an Internet E-mail account. It is, therefore, the policy when disseminating official college business information electronically to use college-assigned accounts. Further, it is the responsibility of students to check their college-assigned E-mail accounts regularly. If a student uses another account as his/her primary account, then mail sent to the college-assigned address should be forwarded to that primary account.**

**An ELM Password** is required to access all Aquinas College applications including email, CourseConnect, MyAQ, Internet Explorer, and discipline-specific software.

As a new Aquinas College student, you will be assigned an ELM password. To acquire your password, a letter will be mailed to you from ITS with a one-time access key and instructions for retrieving a password through a web interface. If you prefer, you can pick up your one-time access key by bringing a picture ID (i.e., Aquinas student ID or driver's license) to one of three official, on-campus Access Key Distribution Offices:

- 1.) Aquinas College Campus Safety-- open 24 hours a day, seven days a week.
- 2.) The ITS Help Desk in AB 350--open during lab hours. See <http://www.aquinas.edu/computer/computerlabs.html> for current information.
- 3.) The Grace Hauenstein Library in JLH--open during library hours.

Your student ID number is needed to retrieve your password. When you set your ongoing password, you will be prompted for personal identifying information which can be used later to reset your password in the event you forget it. Additional course information and/or CourseConnect keys can be obtained from instructors.

**Accessing Your Schedule, Name of Advisor, and Grades:** MyAQ is an on-line resource available for current students to view their schedule, advisor's name, grades, and to search for available classes in a given semester. Additional features will become available at a later date. MyAQ can be accessed at <http://myaq.aquinas.edu> using your ELM password.

### Web-Based Course Information (Using CourseConnect)

To succeed in an on-line course, students must possess strong study skills, self-motivation, and the ability to work independently. While internet courses are every bit as challenging as traditional courses, they require a degree of computer literacy (particularly some basic proficiency on the internet and e-mail), as well as effective time management skills. In internet-enhanced courses, the students, as a group, may not meet on a regular basis as they do in other courses. Thus, a critical key to success is maintaining on-going communications with the instructor and other students in the class by email, on-line chatting within CourseConnect, and telephone/voicemail.

Aquinas College provides direct access to the Internet and email on-campus. On-line courses that use CourseConnect and Aquinas email are also available off-campus. Please visit <http://courses.aquinas.edu> for more information on CourseConnect.

### Recommended computer configurations:

Hardware requirements:

1. A Pentium III 866 MHz or better computer with at least 256 MB of RAM (preferably 512 MB)
2. A monitor capable of 1024 by 768 or higher resolution
3. A high speed Internet connection (DSL/Cable)
4. A Windows XP or above operating system
5. Both a soundcard and CD-ROM drive are highly recommended and may be required for some courses  
*Apple Macintosh computers meeting the above requirements are also acceptable (i.e. Mac OS X or greater).*

Software requirements:

1. An Internet browser, preferably a minimum of Internet Explorer 7, Firefox 1.5 or Safari.
2. Microsoft Office 2007 or greater may be required for some courses.

## GRADUATION and PRIVACY INFORMATION

### Graduation:

*Commencement ceremonies are an annual occurrence and will be held on May 8, 2010.*

**If you intend to graduate in December 2009, May 2010, or August 2010, you should complete an Application for Degree, signed by your major/minor department Chairperson(s), and submit it to the Registrar's Office.**

An application can be obtained either in the Registrar /Academic Advising Center or via our website at [www.aquinas.edu/registrar/forms](http://www.aquinas.edu/registrar/forms).

- The Application for Degree should be taken, along with a copy of your academic record to be reviewed and signed by your major department chairperson and minor department chairperson (if applicable).
- Next, the signed application should be returned to the Registrar/Academic Advising Center for the initial audit, after which you will be notified in writing of the outcome and details regarding the commencement ceremony.

### Campus Safety / Emergency / and Privacy Information:

#### Emergency Closings and Class Cancellations:

Aquinas College maintains a policy of remaining open and holding classes despite inclement weather. College operations will be discontinued only in situations of extreme emergency caused by impassable road conditions, violent weather, energy loss, or other conditions that would seriously endanger the health and safety of our students, faculty, and staff. If locally severe conditions make it inadvisable for you to attend class, you should contact your instructor as soon as possible.

Announcements of closings will be made through area media by 7:00am for day classes and 4:30pm for evening classes. They will be made over WOOD-TV 8, WZZM-Channel 13, WOOD-AM 1300, WOOD-FM 105.7 and WGRD-FM 97.9.

#### Department of Campus Safety:

The Department of Campus Safety, located in the Campus Safety Building on the west edge of the Wege Student Center parking lot, is open to provide protection and services 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. Any emergencies (fire, medical, criminal) should be reported immediately to Campus Safety. #### EDUCATION

#### To all students pursuing elementary teacher certification:

The Michigan Department of Education has mandated significant changes to the requirements for becoming an elementary teacher. Those students currently enrolled in the elementary teacher preparation program have until the end of the Spring 2013 semester to complete all required coursework and student teaching.

In order to assist you in determining whether you will be certified under the current requirements or the new requirements, we encourage you to have your records evaluated by a School of Education advisor. To begin this process, please contact Michele in the School of Education (polegmic@aquinas.edu, 616 632-2440, AB260) with your name, student ID number, major/minor, telephone number, and email address. An advisor in the SOE will evaluate your records and contact you with more information.

**The prerequisite for ALL education courses is sophomore status, minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.500, passing scores on the Michigan Basic Skills Test (MBST) and EN201 unless otherwise noted.**

#### **Michigan Basic Skills Test (MBST)**

A passing score on the MBST is required for all students enrolled in course work leading to teacher certification. This test is given four times a year: January, April, July and October. Registration materials may be picked up in the Registrar and Academic Advising Center or in the School of Education office. Students wishing to register for education classes prior to receiving passing scores on the MBST have the option to take the Aquinas Skills Test. Passing scores on this test will allow students to register the MBST on the next available date. Students must register for the Aquinas Skills Test by calling the School of Education at (616)632-2800.

#### **Michigan Tests for Teacher Certification (Subject Area Tests)**

Prior to certification, all teacher candidates must take and pass tests in their major(s) and minor(s) areas. Elementary certification candidates must take a test in "Elementary Education" as well. You may register on-line at [www.mttc.nesinc.com](http://www.mttc.nesinc.com)

#### **Student Teacher Applications**

All students planning to carry out their Directed Student Teaching placement in the Fall of 2010 are required to fill out a pre-application and an application. The deadline for the applications for Fall of 2010 is 4:00PM on January 15, 2010. If the 15th falls on a weekend or holiday, the application will be due on the next business day.
