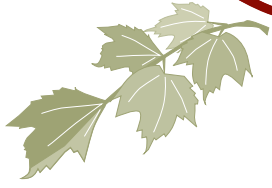
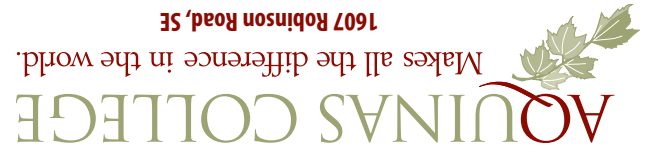

WELCOME TO THE SUMMER OF 2012 AT AQUINAS COLLEGE

Aquinas students may register for any of the summer classes via MyAQ, by mail, by telephone, or by visiting the Registrar's Office, Hruby Hall room 30, during regular business hours. It is recommended to register early to ensure the availability of your selections. You may call the Registrar/Academic Advising Center at (616) 632-2871.

Students new to the College should contact the Admissions Office at (616) 732-4460 for information regarding admission to any of the summer sessions. Guest students are welcome and should use a Guest Application with approval of the parent institution to confirm transferability.

Please note: Summer courses are taught at an ACCELERATED pace. Consequently, students who know they will have to miss the initial class meeting or more than one class during the course should not register for classes. Note also the OVERLAP in session dates. Schedule your classes carefully and be aware of the start dates.

Fees: Tuition per undergraduate semester credit hour is \$488.

Non-attending students who do not officially drop a class within the drop dates listed below and are administratively dropped from a class will be assessed a fee of \$150.00 per class. Summer Holiday Schedule: The College will be closed in observance of Memorial Day on Monday, May 28, 2012. The College will be closed in observance of Independence Day on Wednesday, July 4, 2012.

Freedom of Information Act: According to the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, and more recent regulations governing that act, Aquinas College is in the process of adopting a directory information policy governing the release of student information that would not generally be considered harmful or an invasion of privacy.

For the time being, the Aquinas College Registrar/Academic Advising Center has designated the following as directory information that may be obtained from our office: Verification of enrollment, verification of receipt of degree, major, minor and date of completion of program.

Federal Law (Solomon Amendment) also requires that institutions of higher education provide military recruiters access to directory information including name, address, phone and birth date of currently enrolled students.

If you object to the release of the information mentioned above, you must request in writing that we do not release this information. You may do so to the Registrar/Director of Academic Advising, Aquinas College, 1607 Robinson Road SE, Grand Rapids, MI 49506.

Education Coursework: The prerequisites for all EN courses are: sophomore status, passing scores on the MBST, 2.5 cumulative GPA, and successful completion of EN 201. Additional prerequisites are listed for most courses.

Student Teacher Applications: All students planning to student teach in the Spring of 2013 or Fall of 2013 are required to fill out an application. The deadline for completed student teaching applications is September 15, 2012 for the spring semester of 2013, and January 15, 2013 for the fall semester of 2013. Contact the School of Education for details at (616) 632-2800.

Jazz Camp: June 10 – 15, 2012: To obtain a camp registration form, please contact the Art and Music Center Office at (616) 632-2413 or visit the Aquinas College website at www.aquinas.edu/music. College credit is available for participation in the Jazz Camp; see class schedule.

Private Music Instruction: Students wishing to study voice, organ, piano, or other instrument may contact the Music Department Chairperson, Barbara Witham McCargar for details at (616) 632-2417 or mccargar@aquinas.edu. Offerings are as follows: MCAP 125 Studio Applied Piano; MCAP 131 Studio Applied Organ; MCAP 141 Studio Applied Voice; MCAP 151 Studio Applied Instrumental. Other instruments will be handled on a case by case basis. There is a fee of \$290 for a two-credit lesson, plus tuition for 2 credit hours.

Web-Based Course Information: Aquinas will be offering 13 web-based classes this summer. To succeed in an online course, students must possess strong study skills, self-motivation, and the ability to work independently. While online courses are every bit as challenging as traditional courses, they require a degree of computer literacy (particularly some basic proficiency with internet and email), as well as effective time management skills. In internet-enhanced courses, the students may not meet on a regular basis as a group as they do in other courses. Thus, a key to success is maintaining ongoing communication with the instructor and other students in the class by email and telephone/voicemail.

Aquinas College provides direct access to the internet and email from on-campus. Online courses and Aquinas email are also available off-campus. For best performance on AQnet, we recommend your personal computer meet certain specifications. While these are not requirements, having or exceeding the following specifications will enhance your AQnet experience. Visit www.aquinas.edu/aqnet for additional information.

* Windows XP, Windows Vista, and Windows 7 are currently supported. Microsoft plans to end support for Windows XP in early 2014.

**Please note that antivirus software is required for AQnet use. While Aquinas does not require a specific antivirus package at this time, ITS strongly recommends using the freely available Microsoft Security Essentials. If you are currently paying an annual fee for a security product, you may wish to switch to Microsoft Security Essentials at your next renewal period.

Software Requirements: An Internet browser (preferably a minimum of Internet Explorer 7, Firefox 3 or Safari); Microsoft Office 2007 or greater may be required for some courses.

Password Requirements: Passwords are required to access Aquinas College systems, including web-based services.

Student Password Retrieval Process: Students registering for the first time since summer 2004, who have never received a One-Time Access Key, will receive an informational letter that will contain:

- * their One-Time Access Key
- * instructions for establishing their password

To establish their password online, students will need:

- * their One-Time Access Key
- * their Student ID Number
- * their Social Security Number

If needed, students can also pick up their One-Time Access Key and instructions for setting up their password by taking a picture ID (student ID or driver's license) to Campus Safety, ITS, or Grace Hauenstein Library. Campus Safety is open twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week.
