



# Aquinas College Certificate in Theological Studies

## Steps to follow to learn about and apply for the program

2. To apply for the program, find the links to download the application or apply online at the above web address. There is no fee to apply. Completed paper applications should be sent to the address listed below. For questions about the program, contact one of the following:

3. Please have your school's registrar mail your OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPTS to the Aquinas College Registrar/Advising Center. Aquinas will need transcripts from each college you have attended as well as from the high school you attended.

4. Once the application process is complete and an acceptance letter has been received, contact the Registrar/Advising Center at 616-632-2871 to register for classes.
5. Financial assistance is available to continuing education students who participate in the program. Aquinas College, given its commitment to the local Church, provides a 50% tuition scholarship to C.E. participants for required coursework. This discount may not be combined with other scholarships or discounts offered by Aquinas. 6. The Certificate in Theological Studies will be awarded once the following six required courses (3 credits each) have been successfully completed. These courses are available as day, evening, hybrid, quad, and weekend courses on a rotating basis.
