

Changes to academics

Aquinas has a long tradition of offering students an exceptional educational experience and we are on the cusp of taking that to an entirely new level. Work is underway to shift the College to a new four-credit model that will ultimately allow for more applied, engaged and experiential learning for our students. After the challenges presented by the COVID-19 pandemic the last two years, we are very much looking forward to returning to a more typical Commencement celebration for this year's graduates. A Baccalaureate Mass and Commencement Ceremony for the class of 2022 will take place on Saturday, May 7. We are immensely proud of these graduates and their perseverance.

A FOREVER GIFT FOR MOM AND DAD

As part of Aquinas College's 125thanniversary celebration in 2012, there was an initiative to grow endowed scholarships. Kate Davis, who works for the College's Office of Advancement, saw many families creating scholarships and was struck with an idea. She and her sister Laura agreed to work together to establish a scholarship in honor of their parents—a kind and generous gift that keeps giving.

Kate and Laura's parents, Joe and Kathy Westdorp, graduated from Grand Rapids Catholic Central High School. Joe received a fullride scholarship to attend Aquinas College, while Kathy headed off to the University of Michigan. She transferred to Aquinas her junior year.

Both music majors, Kathy remembers being on the third floor of the Academic Building in 1959, where the music department was housed at the time, when Joe asked her on their first date. "My Dad always said that if she had turned him down, he wouldn't have asked again. It took so much courage. Thank goodness she said yes," Kate joked. Joe and Kathy left Aquinas just credits shy of graduating to get married. They worked together at the Basilica of St. Adalbert's, where Joe was the organist and adult choir leader for nearly 60 years, while Kathy led the children's choirs. They raised four wonderful daughters. Kathy sang with various organizations in town, including the Grand Rapids Opera, and also taught music in the public school system and at West Catholic High School. Joe worked for Spartan stores. Eventually, they both returned to Aquinas to finish their degrees. Kathy first in 1980 and Joe later in 1999.

"The Catholic education we received at Aquinas shaped our lives and certainly helped us in our careers," Kathy said. "Being a small school, the relationships were so important. It was a family. Many of the Dominican Sisters were our classmates and friends."

With Aquinas playing such a special role in their lives, it means a lot to know that through the Joseph A. and Kathleen M. Driza Westdorp Family Scholarship that Kate and Laura established, their names will be part of the College forever. "It was a stretch for us to make this gift, but seeing how excited they were, it felt really good," Kate said. "We told them we want to do this in honor of you, but it will be Christmas, birthdays and other presents for a few years," Laura added.

"We just couldn't believe that they would do something so big for us," Kathy said.


Since establishing the scholarship, other family members have joined in making gifts to the scholarship to help it grow. And when Joe sadly passed away last year, friends and loved ones made contributions to the Fund in his memory.

"Someone helped our dad come to Aquinas on a scholarship," Laura said. "All these pieces fell together to form them [Joe and Kathy], and they formed who we are. Now we have a chance to help someone else."

"I love hearing the students' stories. They are so thankful for the scholarships. It really touches me to know that we are making a difference and it will go on for years to come," Kathy said. "What you give, you get back. It is all in God's plan."

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JUSTIN, WHAT BROUGHT YOU TO AQUINAS?

My brother attended Aquinas, but it was really basketball that brought me here. We have a great team and culture. I had planned to study biology my parents wanted me to be a doctor. My roommate was studying marketing and had a passion for stocks. I became interested in the financial markets and decided to change my focus. I am double majoring in accounting and business.

WHAT'S IT LIKE BEING A STUDENT ATHLETE?

Athletics is a family. It's been a whole new experience—continuing to play a sport I love, traveling, meeting alumni and donors. Most importantly winning this year has created a great memorable experience.

The level of difficulty and the time you have to put into your classes has developed me as a young man. You need grit to go from practice to a 6-10 p.m. class, and then get up and do it all again early the next morning. It takes a lot of devotion and discipline. It's not easy, but it's worth it.

HOW HAS SCHOLARSHIP SUPPORT HELPED YOU?

I received two donor-funded scholarships and a basketball scholarship. I wouldn't be here without that support. They created an opportunity for me to be part of the community and access opportunities outside of campus, like my internship. Scholarships were the foundation that helped mold me as a young man and jumpstart my career.

YOUR PARENTS ARE YOUR BIGGEST FANS. WHAT DOES THEIR SUPPORT MEAN TO YOU?

The support from my parents has been everything. They've pushed me through hard times. Their advice and mentorship means a lot. No one gets through college alone. Also, I love being able to look up at a game and not have to worry about whether or not they are in the stands. They're always there.

HOW HAS AQUINAS IMPACTED YOU AS A PERSON?

Aquinas has made me a more well-rounded individual—academically and socially. I value the relationships I've developed with my professors. I was in Professor Cantley's office recently watching sports videos. I don't think I'd have those close personal relationships at a larger institution.

5 Questions with Beth Laux, Ed.D. '02

In each issue of Canopy, we feature an alumna or alumnus who has given back to Aquinas College with financial support. Beth Laux set up a monthly recurring gift for political science, and when the College shares a need, she generously responds. Beth knows that giving back can make a world of difference to a student, a family and even a community.

1. How did you choose to attend AQ?

I discovered Aquinas at a college fair. I had already decided to go to a university in Ohio, but the representative from Aquinas was really enthusiastic. The more I learned about the College. the more I felt that it aligned with my values. So I decided to attend Aquinas instead.

experience at Aquinas shape who you are today? Aquinas played a critical role in my faith journey. My experiences with Campus Ministry and the College community helped solidify my identity as a Catholic woman. It helped me examine what I believe and why. and that motivated me to share my faith with others. I spent two years as a missionary in Central America. and I am still an active Catholic who volunteers in her church and community.

In what ways did your education at Aquinas prepare you for your current role? During my time at Aquinas, I studied in Costa Rica and Spain. Those experiences profoundly impacted how I understood the world and my place in it. I became a better communicator and negotiator. The experiences made me more creative and resilient, too. After graduation, I started working in international education, and 20 years later I'm still helping universities create cultural experiences for students.

4. What do you think is the most unique/ special/significant aspect of Aquinas College? When I arrived at Aquinas, I didn't have a lot of confidence. I was very quiet and had a lot of self-doubts. But the faculty at Aquinas took me under their wing. They helped me build my confidence and challenged me to become more than I thought was possible. That relationship between faculty and students

is really special.

As an alumna, why is giving back to the College with your time, talent and treasure important to you? As a first generation college student, the impact of my education went beyond myself as an individual. It impacted my entire family. The knowledge and experiences that I gained at Aquinas opened social, economic. and political doors that had been closed to my family for generations. I wanted to make those opportunities accessible to other families, and giving to the College is my way of doing that.
